Driven to End Malaria – KSrelief Leads the Way

A Crisis Hidden in Plain Sight

Many assume malaria is a solved problem – a disease in retreat, steadily fading from the world's health agenda. That assumption is wrong.

In 2024 alone, malaria infected 282 million people and killed 610,000 – the majority of them children under five. In conflict zones like Yemen, where health systems have collapsed, the disease spreads unchecked (WHO World Malaria Report, 2025).

Malaria is not under control. It is escalating – and it is killing the most vulnerable.

This April, on World Malaria Day, the global community rallies under the theme "Driven to End Malaria: Now We Can. Now We Must." Since 2020, KSrelief has answered that call – deploying teams, distributing millions of mosquito nets, and working alongside international partners to protect communities where malaria hits hardest.
